A MOOC is an online course aimed at wide participation and open access via the Internet. It provides materials for studying from distance, presented through videos, readings, and other media, and engages learners through forums to encourage interaction and feedback. Carried out in the context of Erasmus+ Programme, the MOOCs focus on the priority areas of the programme.

Altogether, 616 people from Albania, Algeria, Armenia, Aruba (NL), Austria, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Colombia, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Egypt, Estonia, Finland, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, France, Georgia, Germany, Ghana, Greece, Hungary, India, Iraq, Ireland, Israel, Italy, Jordan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lebanon, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Moldova, Morocco, Netherlands, Nigeria, Norway, Pakistan, Palestinian Territory, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russian Federation, Serbia, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Syria, Tunisia, Turkey, Uganda, Ukraine, United Kingdom, and Venezuela took part in the project.

The overall aim and specific objectives of the project:

Understand how to use various funding opportunities and fulfill the funding requirements for international youth exchanges, European voluntary service, and mobility of youth workers through Erasmus+ Youth in Action Programme. Learn how to start developing youth and youth workers mobility projects.

Discover good practice examples, tips and hints for developing good quality projects.

Network with other participants of this course and share your knowledge and ideas with them.

Main contents and activities of the project:

The course offered interactive learning contents online using the Canvas.net platform for hosting Massive Open Online Courses. Participants were learning through animated videos, pre-recorded video interviews, video examples from projects. They could take part in online discussions with their peers and practice their knowledge through completing quizzes. Participants were redirected to various educational resources related to international youth work outside of the course.
